Sinotech's products are used in the international Automotive, Medical, Printing and Transportation markets.



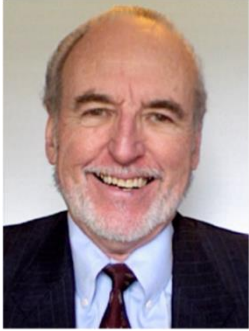
JEFFREY KINKLEY, DIRECTOR
